New Year's is a time of new beginnings. John Adams and Thomas Jefferson had been at odds for 14 years over the "Alien and Sedition Act". On New Year's Day 1812 Adams wrote.

"Dear Sir, As you are a friend to American manufactures under proper restrictions, especially manufactures of the American kind, I am sending you by the post a packet containing two pieces of homespun lately produced in this quarter by one who was honored in his youth with some of your attention and much of your kindness." He finished with, "I wish you Sir many Happy New Year."

The 'two pieces of homespun' were actually two books written by his son, John Quincy Adams. Jefferson replied with a letter fondly recalling when they were fellow laborers in the same cause. The two ex-presidents resumed their correspondence for the next 14 years. On July 4, 1826, the 90-year-old Adams lay on his deathbed. His last words were "Jefferson still survives." He was wrong; Jefferson died five hours earlier.

Compatriot Kim Morton, Charter Member and Chapter Genealogist, Educator, is our featured January Speaker. He will be discussing US Occupation of Japan after WWII using artifacts brought home from his father who was an officer in the occupation forces after the Japanese Emperor Hirohito surrender 1945. The Emperor announced the surrender to the Japanese people who had never heard his voice before following the August 6th Atomic Blast on Hiroshima. The surrender documents were signed on September 2, 1945, bring the hostilities of WII to a close. However, there was still some isolated fighting by

Japanese forces.


Beginning in 1945 through 1952, the occupying forces led by General Douglas MacArthur enacted widespread military, political, economic, and social reforms. Prior to the defeat of Japan, conferences were held by the allies, China, the Soviet Union, and Great Britain as to how to disarm Japan, what to do with the Japanese colonies, especially of Korea and Taiwan, how to stabilized the Japanese economy, and prevent remilitarization in the future. Beginning in 1945 through 1952, the occupying forces led by General Douglas MacArthur enacted widespread military,



political, economic, and social reforms. When the first American Forces ferried from the troop ships landed on Japanese soil, they came ashore armed but with no ammunition under MacArthur's orders. The General wanted no incidents between the American GI's and the Japanese which could potentially lead to warfare on the mainland.

Occupation forces were soon to follow replacing the forces; veterans of the Pacific. Among the occupation force was Kim Morton's father. LGS



Quick Cranberry Gelatin Salad

Many asked for Sarah Potter's recipe for the Cranberry Gelatin Salad. She has graciously provided it.

Ingredients

1 package (6 ounces) cherry gelatin

1-1/2 cups boiling water

1 can (20 ounces) **DOLE®** crushed pineapple, undrained

1 can (14 ounces) whole-berry cranberry sauce

1-1/2 cups seedless red grapes, halved

1/4 cup chopped pecans

Directions

- 1. In a large bowl, dissolve gelatin in water.
- Stir in pineapple and cranberry sauce.
- Refrigerate for 30 minutes.
- Stir in grapes and pecans.
- Pour into a 2-qt. serving bowl.
- Refrigerate until firm.
