Cowpens Victory due to Morgan's Tactics

On Jan. 17th, 1781, General Daniel Morgan brilliantly deployed his troops in a feigned retreat enabling his men to envelop the British. When the British moved into the trap, 110 were killed and 830 were captured. Banastre Tarleton and a handful of the British escaped. "The American casualties were 12 men killed and 61 wounded." (Statistics from Chronicle of America.)
