MINUTES OF MEETING OF MAY S, 2001


After Laurence Crapo's presentation of "My Ancestors Came Over On The Mayflower", a presentation giving sources of mayflower genealogical information, and the truth about those who made the pilgrimage to form Plymouth. The short business meeting was brought to order by President James J Johnson at 8:06 PM. Bill Bell moved that the April 5th Minutes be approved, seconded by Vice President Sam Haynes. MAYFLOWER - Laurence Crapo

In 1620 the small vessel, Mayflower, landed at Plymouth, establishing the first permanent colony in North America. The passengers, men, women and children, referred to as Pilgrims, left England because King James I, did not permit religious freedom. The King required that every citizen belong to the official state church, the Church of England. Puritans set out to purify the state church. The Separatists wanted a separate denomination. The Pilgrims were part of the Separatist group. They first fled to Holland. But there, they had difficulty making a living. Three years later, they obtained a patent from the Virginia Company of London to settle in the New World. After much difficulty with leaking ships and other problems, they left Plymouth, England on September 16, 1620. Mr. Laurence Capo's ancestor was on board.
