#### A Lafayette Farewell Tour story (WHAT'S YOURS?)

My Patriot's Son, Major John Hereford, met Lafayette again in 1825 along the Ohio River, as Lafayette traveled up from Cincinnati on a steamboat, with a stop in Gallipolis, Ohio May 22, 1825.

Boats were then fired by wood. Every few miles some enterprising citizens would have a wood yard, stacked high and cut to the lengths the boat used, and these lengths were then carried aboard by the deck hands.

The boat carrying Lafayette came into a wood yard just above John Hereford's home in Virginia (now West Virginia). He, with many others, started down the bank to watch the boat lay in her supply of wood. A tall man on the top deck of the boat halted John with "Hey there, Hereford, come aboard for I want to see you." John Hereford then boarded the boat and was kissed and embraced by Lafayette, who showed in many ways his pleasure at meeting his old friend and aide. Upon returning home, John told of their meeting and how great was his pleasure at meeting his oldtime friend, and seeing his idolized General once more and in their short interview, Lafayette told of his intention of staying over several days in Gallipolis and could it be arranged that he could see Hereford the next day. John told his wife "Of course, I will go and see him". He made preparations for an early horseback ride to Gallipolis the next morning and by daylight was on his way.

It was related that when John Hereford got out of a skiff at the water's edge, Lafayette was standing on the top the bank, exclaiming over the beautiful Ohio River, and as John ascended, Lafayette descended and the two soldiers met halfway and Lafayette grasp John by the hand and standing there for several moments, the tears streaming down the cheeks of both of them, their hearts too full for words. John Hereford was as emotional as Lafayette. The friendship of these two men endured for their natural lives, cemented with a personal gift from Lafayette. At the close of the war, when the soldiers were being disbanded for their return home, Lafayette to show his appreciation and admiration and friendship for his aide John Hereford, presented him (John) with his (Lafayette's) own sword, unbuckling it from his side handed it to John Hereford to keep always as a remembrance from his Chief, and to the day of his death, John Hereford cherished it as one of his most prised possessions.



# Lafayette in America in 1824 and 1825 (Vol. 1&2): An Eyewitness Account of the Landmark Tour of the United States by General Gilbert du Motier

Lafayette in America in 1824 and 1825 is a journal of Auguste Levasseur who accompanied General Gilbert du Motier, Marquis de Lafayette on the tour of all the 24 States in 1824-1825at the invitation of Congress President, Monroe, and the American people.

General Lafayette was a French aristocrat and military officer who fought in the American Revolutionary War, commanding American troops in several battles, including the siege of Yorktown.

After returning to France, he was a key figure in the French Revolution of 1789 and the July Revolution of 1830. He has been considered a national hero in both countries and known as "The Hero of the Two Worlds." President James Monroe and Congress invited Lafayette in part to celebrate the nation's upcoming 50th anniversary and intended to have him travel on an American warship, but Lafayette felt that having such a vessel as transport was undemocratic and booked passage on a merchantman. Louis XVIII did not approve of the trip and had troops disperse the crowd that gathered at Le Havre to see him off.

Lafayette arrived at New York on 15 August 1824, accompanied by his son Georges Washington and his secretary Auguste Levasseur. He was greeted by a group of Revolutionary War veterans who had fought alongside him many years before. New York erupted for four continuous days and nights of celebration. He then departed for what he thought would be a restful trip to Boston but instead found the route lined by cheering citizens, with welcomes organized in every town along the way.

This book also contains the details of Lafayette's visits with Founding Fathers and addresses slavery and Native American issues.
