NEW SAR-DAR YOUTH AWARD

Our chapter's Education Committee implemented an Essay Contest for 8th Graders. It was patterned after national SAR essay contests, suitably simplified for the middle school student, but offering experience that will encourage entry into our traditional essay contests for high school students. The 8th grade was targeted because in the State of Texas this is the grade where the American Revolution is introduced, by law. To broaden the support base of the contest, we invited the San Antonio de Bexar Chapter of DAR to join us in sponsoring and funding the contest. They accepted and certainly made an excellent contribution.

To gain some experience with the contest, we selected Harris Middle School because the school has for many years included SAR in their Annual History Faire. We coupled the timing of the contest to (1) the month in which the American Revolution was (Cont'd on Pg 2)

being taught and (2) the month of the History Faire. This approach allows our SAR participants to meet one-on-one with the students and discuss topics they have selected for their essay. Award winners include:

- **First place** went to **Lance Campbell** for an essay entitled: "Ranging . . . A New Type of Warfare."
- **Second place** went to **Elizabeth Pilotte** for an essay entitled: "John Trumbull: A Revolutionary War Artist".
- **Third place** went to **Sofia N. Lopez** for an essay entitled: "Hidden Heroine Heroism".

Lance Campbell has already been recognized and honored, with his family, at our annual DAR/SAR Christmas Luncheon December 3, 2011 at the San Antonio Country Club.

All the winners will be recognized and honored at Harris Middle School, during the annual Choir Program on February 23, 2012.

The next contest is being planned for Tejeda Middle School in the Spring, using approximate the same procedure. Tejeda is the only other local school sponsoring an annual History Faire, to which we have been invited. After absorbing "lessons learned" from these experiences with Harris and Tejeda, we may decide to expand the 8th grade Essay Contest to other local schools next year.
