OPERATION GENEALOGY RESEARCH

Based on an Agreement between the National Society SAR and Ancestry.Com, Operation Genealogy Research was launched at Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington, DC last year Wounded Warriors. Through the dedicated leadership of Compatriot Edward F. Butler, Past President-General (2009-2010), NSSAR, the program was set up for Wounded Warriors and their families at Brook Army Medical Center in San Antonio. With the stalwart support of Compatriot Peter Baron, our Chapter began our training programs in September at the Family Support Center at Ft. Sam Houston. Classes are conducted two times per month. Other compatriots are James Taylor, Frank Rohrbough, Jay Lewallen, John Orr and Peter Goebel.



Compatriot Tom Green, Past President of the Texas Society SAR, was our Guest Speaker at our September 21st Chapter Meeting. His well-known presentation on early American Revolutionary Flags has been given at many elementary and middle schools, historical events and programs sponsored by other SAR and DAR Chapters. We enjoyed hearing of the historical background on the flags used by many of the State Militias across Colonial America. **(Left)** Compatriot Green describes how the Betsy Ross Flag was designed and put into use during the early stages of our fight for Independence starting in 1775.

GARCIA FAMILY INDUCTED

At our September Chapter Meeting, seven members of the Garcia Family were inducted into the Sons of the American Revolution and the San Antonio Chapter of the Texas Society. Yolanda McKinney, a sister of the brothers, worked with Compatriot Tom Green to complete the applications for membership for her 5 brothers, 2 nephews and 1 grandnephew. Their patriot ancestors were sent by the King of Spain to Texas in 1731 from the Canary Islands. The family has a long history of military and civil service to our country. Nephew David Edward Garcia was in college and unable to attend.

Over 50 Chapter members, including our Chapter President, James C. Taylor, and Past President-General (2009-2010) Edward F, Butler, II, witnessed this event and personally welcomed each of these inductees into the National Society, the Texas Society and our local Chapter. This is the largest Family induction ever into our Chapter.

Three generations from Alfred Frasier to his son Jay Frasier and grandson Justin recently had their applications for membership approved. All were descendants of Patriot Ancestor Sherrod Simms (b. 1730) from North Carolina who took the Oath of Allegiance to the Patriotic Cause in 1778. Compatriot Earns 25 Year Pin

Compatriot Edward F. Butler, II, was recognized by President James C. Taylor at the October 19th Chapter Meeting for his 25 years for dedicated service to Sons of the American Revolution. Judge Edward F. Butler, Sr. is a retired U.S. Administrative Law Judge having served as Presiding Municipal Judge for South Padre Island, Texas. He is a graduate of Vanderbilt University School of Law, and was a board certified civil trial lawyer before assuming full time duties on the bench. He was commissioned as an Ensign in the U.S. Navy Reserve in 1963. He served continuously in the Navy reserve for 27 years as a Naval Intelligence officer. He retired in 1990 as a Commander (O-5), with 35 years of military service.

Since his retirement in 1997, he has devoted a considerable amount of his time and energy to the Sons of the American Revolution, to include the San Antonio Chapter, the Texas Society and the National Society. Most recently during the year July 2009 to July 2010, he served as the President General of the National Society, a position that resulted in he and his wife Robin (who is with him today) traveling to many State Society's across the county and to France, Spain, Germany and England. In all, they traveled more than 80,000 miles or 3 times around the world.

Compatriot Butler is a frequent speaker on historical and genealogical topics, and is a regular contributor to national and state historical and genealogical society journals and magazines. He is the author of six books, three of which are on family history.

Judge Butler is an active member of the National Genealogical Society, the Texas Genealogical Society, and the San Antonio Historical and Genealogical Society. Judge Butler's special interest in Spain's assistance to the colonists during the American Revolutionary War has drawn the attention of many Texians to learn more about "Texas' Connection to the American Revolution".
